In February, we purchased two truckloads of sand or about 34 cubic yards. The sand is premixed with clay and is commonly referred to as clay sand. The goal was to improve the runway conditions from deterioration that normally occurs over time. The maintenance work focused on the center of the runway from east to west. RC pilots with delicate planes or retracts should aim for the center of the runway for smoothest possible landings.
